Upcoming Shoots and Events

- The **July Trap Shoot** will be **July 27**, at 8:00am on the Shotgun Range. We're doing an earlier start time because we anticipate to be either HOT or hit by a monsoon. Earlier the better in either case!
- The **Trophy Trap Shoot** will be **August 24**, at 8:00 on the Shotgun Range. This one is early too. Monsoons will probably be done, but it will most likely be hot still.
- We haven't set a date yet, but the **Frontier Shoot** is going to be **in September**, sometime after the Apache County Fair. I haven't been to one, but I heard rumors of wearing bonnets and using black powder...
- The Gun Show will be October 12th and 13th at the Apache County Fairgrounds in St. Johns.

Continuous Shoots and Events

- The **Scholastic Clays Target Program** is held on the first Saturday of every month at 10:00am on the Shotgun Range. The next one will be **July 6**. - The **Board of Directors meeting** is held on the second Friday of every month, 6:30pm at the St. Johns public library. The next one will be **July 12**. Members are encouraged to attend.
- The **Scholastic Steel Challenge** is held on the second Saturday of every month at 9:00am on the Main Range. The next one will be **July 13**. Participants need to bring 350 rounds of .22LR/9mm Luger each month, safety glasses, hearing protection, and a hat with a brim for spent brass protection. There will be 9mm and .22 pistols available, or the participant can bring their own pistol. <u>General SSC information can be found here</u>. Our contact at the Arizona Game and Fish said that the money for the fence is ready to go. We're sending him the quotes for materials we got. We're going to schedule now with Apache County to get the fence put in. It will be a fairly big project. Not sure how long it will take, but all-in-all, it will be about 3 miles of fence going up & down those steep hills out there. Not a project that can be whipped out in a few days!

I would like to personally ask for your help in keeping the fence up. If you ride four wheelers/motorcycles at the Blue Hills or know people who do, spread the word that a new fence is going up, and please keep it up. It's more for the safety of 'other people' than it is for shooters. I personally have had people who started out riding at the Blue Hills suddenly appear downrange, and not even realize that they had just presented themselves on an active firing range!
